"Lincoln, NE: Haymarket Park, near the city center, is one of the largest viewing sites in the area. On the day of the eclipse, professors from the University of Nebraska's department of physics and astronomy will set up sun-viewing telescopes and will be on hand to answer questions. 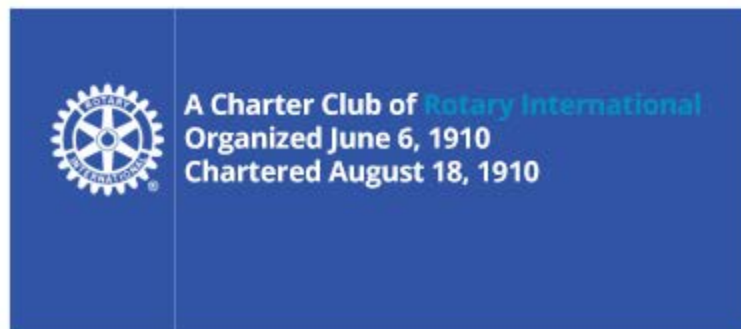
