TUESDAY, JUNE 11 — MARK TAYLOR, “THE ALZHEIMER’S CRISIS TODAY”

Alzheimer’s Disease is no longer a taboo topic. It’s the 6th leading cause of death in the U.S., and with our aging baby boomer population, it’s only going to get worse. Join us on Tuesday, when you’ll learn not just about the disease, but how it affects all of us, whether you know someone with Alzheimer’s or not.

Mark Taylor is the Development Director of the Great Plains Chapter of the Alzheimer’s Association, which serves 80 counties in Nebraska and all of Wyoming. Prior to his work in the non-profit sector, he had a 20-year career in radio, most recently as co-host of the KFOR Morning Show for six years.

LAST WEEK

Art Zygielbaum introduced fellow Lincoln Rotary #14 member and our speaker, Priscilla Grew to share her program, “Let’s Go To The Museum!”. Priscilla talked about the amazing museums within the Nebraska State Museum system. Ashfall Fossil Beds is one of 14 sites world wide highlighted for EvoTourism (tourism centered around Evolution). The Rhino Barn at Ashfall Fossil beds has grown 14 times larger than originally intended. In general, fossils are hard to find because most bones are not preserved; they are quickly re-absorbed into the natural environment. The intact nature of the fossils is part of the reason that places like Ashfall are so incredibly unique!

Trailside Museum at Ft. Robinson State Park has the world’s only fossil of two animals preserved locked in combat. Students and professors around the US are studying Nebraska fossils to determine how and when the animals died.

“Sunday with a Scientist” on Father’s Day at Morrill Hall is chemistry, Harry Potter style. One of the premiere UNL scientists will be teaching about chemistry similar to the spells in the popular Harry Potter series. This will be a great event for dads and kids!

It is easy to see Priscilla’s passion and enthusiasm for the Nebraska State Museums! The Museums are fortunate to have her leadership and Rotary Club #14 is fortunate to have her as a member!
