## PREVIEW

On Tuesday, June 1, University of Nebraska-Lincoln Chancellor **Harvey Perlman, J.D.**, will be our speaker. Named the 19th Chancellor of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln on April 1, 2001, Perlman was raised in York, and earned a bachelor of arts in history and a juris doctorate from the University of Nebraska. He served as dean of the University of Nebraska College of Law from 1983 - 1998.

His area of legal expertise lies in torts and intellectual property. He is co-author of "Intellectual Property and Unfair Competition" (5th edition, 1998) and co-reporter for the "Restatement of Unfair Competition" (1994). In February 2002, Perlman was named a Life Fellow of the American Bar Foundation. Fellow status denotes an individual who has demonstrated outstanding dedication to the welfare of his or her community and is committed to the highest principles of the legal profession. Only the top one-third of one percent of the legal profession is eligible for nomination as a Fellow.

At the University of Nebraska, he chairs the Nebraska Bioethics Advisory Panel, is a member of the Nebraska State Fair Board, the Bowl Championship Series Presidential Oversight Committee, and served on the search committee for the President of the University of Nebraska position.

Mr. Mamdani and his late wife came to UNMC to treat her cancer. In 1999, the international health care program was established under Mr. Mamdani's leadership and currently has 56 partnerships in 27 countries. They also have 18 team members placed in other countries, and bring students to Omaha to conduct research. The training offered to international health care professionals is offered free-of-charge to participants because of a foundation established by Mr. & Mrs. Mamdani. The program includes training at UNMC, training at the partner's facility, and year round exchange programs to only mention a few. One of the program's goals is to establish long-term relationships with other health care professionals and facilities to insure that the best possible health care is available throughout the world.
